The society has also instituted various awards for recognizing and appreciating the active academicians and practitioners in India.

About the Department of Criminology, University of Madras

- Theoretical and empirical research papers should pertain to any of the sub-themes of the conference.
- An Abstract of 150 words should be sent on or before 31 January 2025. Abstracts will be published in the Book of Abstracts and distributed to participants at the conference.
- A Full paper not exceeding 5,000 words should be sent on or before 10 February 2025.
- Papers should be in Times New Roman font, 12 point with double line spacing, leaving margin space on all sides.
- An Expert Committee will screen all abstracts and accept those that are relevant to the conference theme/sub-themes
- ISC maintains the exclusive right to publish accepted papers for presentation as the Conference Volume.

The Indian Society of Criminology (ISC): Call for Awards

The ISC has instituted various awards in order to recognize the contributions of the academicians and practitioners since its inception:

The ISC – Kumarappa - Reckless Award was instituted in the year 1973 in order to recognize a person who has made significant contributions to teaching, research or administration (practitioner) in the broad field of Criminology or Criminal Justice Administration.

The ISC – Dr. B.S. Haikerwal and Professor Sushil Chandra Award for the Senior Social Scientist was instituted in the year 1989 to be presented to a senior social scientist for his /her contribution to criminology in the broad field of social sciences.

The ISC – Professor S.S. Srivastava Award for Excellence in Teaching and Research in Criminology was instituted in the year 2005 to identify persons who have significantly contributed in Teaching and Research in Criminology.

Fellow of the Indian Society of Criminology (FISC) are awarded to the persons who have helped to advance the objects of the society through the channel of the Indian Society of Criminology by participating in its activities and facilitating its growth.

Young Criminologist Award

The Indian Society of Criminology awards one Gold medal and one Silver medal (with cash prize Rs. 5000 and Rs. 3000, respectively) for the best research papers in the field of Criminology, Criminal Justice and allied fields. The research paper should be an outcome of scientific/empirical research carried out by young practitioner/research scholar/student below 35 years of age. The full paper with abstract should be sent to the Secretary, ISC through email: isccontact1970@gmail.com on or before 10 February, 2025 with mention of "Young Criminologist Award" in the subject of email.
